


























Introduction to the location





Lviv is a city in western Ukraine, around 70 kilometers from the border with Poland. Traces of its Polish and Austro-Hungarian heritage are evident in its architecture. Lviv is the largest city in western Ukraine, with a population of 755 800 as of 2020. It is one of the main cultural centres of Ukraine.

The Persenkivka site is located in the southern part of Lviv, Ukraine. Its surroundings include living (appartment buildings), the new IT park, as well as an industrial zone, the Lviv Bus Plant, which is no longer in use. There are two borderlines of the site, the Stryiska Street on the east and the Persenkivka Street on the north. Of great importance is the Railroad (parellel with Persenkivka St.), together with the Persenkivka Train Station. This points out that this would be a prominent location.
